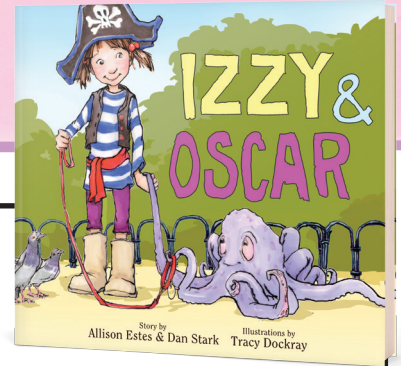
Captain Izzy needs a pet! Follow the maze to help her find Oscar.

CREATE YOUR OWN OSCAR!

What you'll need:

- Coloring/decorating materials
- Scissors
- Tape or glue
- Red string (optional)

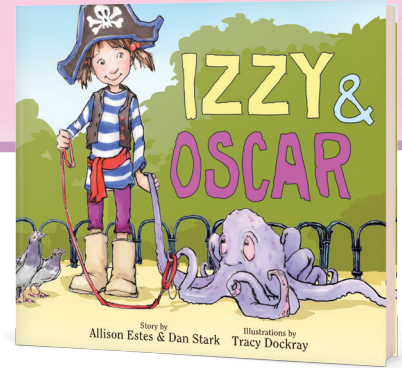


Instructions:

1. Have the students color/decorate the outline below.
2. Once everyone is done, direct the students to cut along the outer dotted line.
3. Once the rectangle is cut out, direct the students to cut along the inner dotted lines to make the octopus's legs.
4. Slightly bend each leg so that the octopus can sit up on its own.
5. (Optional) Cut a piece of red string and tape or glue it around the paper octopus to use as a leash—just like Izzy tried to do with Oscar!

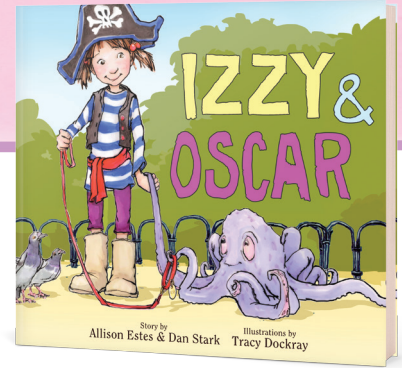

PLAY THESE FUN IZZY & OSCAR-THEMED GAMES IN YOUR CLASSROOM OR LIBRARY!

PIN THE LEGS ON THE OCTOPUS

Draw a large circle on a piece of cardboard to make the body of the octopus. Cut eight legs out of construction paper and give each player a leg and a pushpin. Have the blindfolded players take turns trying to pin a leg on the octopus. The player with the leg closest to the right position wins!

OCTOPUS BEANBAG TOSS

Create a beanbag toss and throw fish-shaped beanbags through the octopus's mouth!

TREASURE HUNT

Captain Izzy is hunting for treasure when she finds Oscar. To create your own treasure hunt, place paper tentacles around your classroom or library, with clues leading teams to each hiding place. The first team to collect eight paper tentacles to make a full octopus wins!
