
Stealing Parker by Miranda Kenneally Discussion Guide

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. At the beginning of Stealing Parker, Parker has given up the things she cares about because she doesn't want people to compare her to her mother, who recently came out, divorced her father, and left town with another woman. Parker also kisses lots of guys to show she's not like her mother. Do you understand why Parker behaves this way? Is it understandable or inexcusable?
- 2. When Parker meets Brian, the new coach of the baseball team, she discovers he's 23 while she's only 17. Regardless, they are attracted to each other. Do you think age or position should factor when deciding whether to pursue a relationship?
- **3.** Brian is 23 and a teacher. He should not be entering into a relationship with a student and he knows that. Why do you think Brian is interested in Parker? What changes during the course of the story that makes him pursue her?
- 4. Parker's mother tells her that the only thing that matters is what Parker wants. Do you agree with this statement? Or do you feel life needs balance?
- 5. During the book, Parker discovers that her best friend, Drew, has a crush on Will "Corndog". Do you think just because Drew likes Corndog, that Parker should put aside her feelings for him to support her friend? Are Drew's actions understandable or inexcusable? Are both Parker and Drew at fault?
- 6. Brian leaves town without saying goodbye to Parker. Where do you think he is now? How do you think his relationship with Parker changed him, for better or worse?
- T. How does Parker develop throughout the course of the story?
- 8. What do you think will happen between Parker and Will "Corndog"?
- **9.** How do you think Parker will approach friendships and relationships in the future?
