
# The Forgetting by Nicole Maggi Discussion Guide



## **Discussion Guide**





- 2. In what ways does Georgie change over the course of the novel? Do you think it was Annabel's heart forcing the change or do you think that Georgie would've changed in the same way regardless?
- 3. If you received a heart transplant, would you be determined to learn the identity of your donor and find out about their life?
- **4.** Nate got involved with FAIR girls because of his sister, Sarah. Do you think it's his quest to find Sarah that keeps him involved? Is there a deeper motivation?
- 5. If she hadn't had a heart transplant and gotten involved in Annabel's world, do you think that Georgie would've continued on her path to Juilliard? Was it a goal she truly wanted for herself, or one that was placed in front of her to strive for?
- 6. Where do you think our memories are contained? Do you think any parts of our memories or our souls are imprinted on our hearts, like Annabel's were? Do you believe in this phenomenon known as cellular memory in medical circles?
- 7. Did the structure of the story fit the journey that Georgie was on? Were there any twists along the way that surprised you?
- 8. Were there any decisions that Georgie made along the way that you thought were wrong? What would you have done differently?
- 9. Do you think there is human trafficking going on in the area where you live, and would you know how to recognize a trafficked child if you saw one?
- 10. Georgie's life goal is to play oboe in a major symphony orchestra. After her heart transplant, she tells Nate that she feels this goal is frivolous now, that she should be doing something more important. Nate replies that bringing art and music to the world is important. Do you agree? Do you think that pursuing art as a career is frivolous?
- 11. Why do you think it was so important to Annabel that the other girls be saved when she knew that she herself wouldn't be? What drove Annabel to help everyone else when she couldn't help herself?
- 12. What do you think happens to Georgie after the novel? Do you think she gets her memories back? Do you think she goes on to Juilliard like she planned, or do you think she chooses to do something else with her life?
