



## SNAPSHOT SUMMARY

Jenna Medina and her family are embarking on a seven-day cruise to the Bahamas, courtesy of her stepfather, Leo, and his designer corporation. Unfortunately, three of her siblings contract chicken pox, and her mother, Betty, is forced to stay home with them. Four members of the Cupcake Club replace them: Kylie, Lexi, Sadie, and Delaney. In return, the girls must provide twelve thousand cupcakes for the

costume party on board. Marisol, Jenna's older sister, secures a job on the cruise ship as an assistant photographer and decides that this will be her future career. A rainstorm almost destroys the Cupcake display, but Jenna is able to salvage some of the cakes. The gala is a huge success, despite the weather.



Jenna Medina, the chief taster of the Cupcake Club, and her family are invited to join her stepfather's corporation cruise to the Bahamas. In the interim, she, Lexi, Sadie, Kylie, and Delaney work on an order of twelve dozen red, white, and blue cupcakes, decorated with a fondant George Washington on each, for the Mt. Vernon Library's fundraising cocktail party. The number of cakes needed is suddenly doubled, and the girls form an assembly line to complete the task on time.

Upon delivery, the bakers find the library closed and are forced to leave the boxes with a local neighbor, Harold Hammond, a professional photographer. He befriends Marisol, Jenna's older sister, who secretly longs to follow a similar path. Both are hired to take pictures on the cruise.

Sadly, three of Jenna's siblings come down with chicken pox, and her mother remains at home to care for them. They are replaced by the four members of the Cupcake Club, with the provision that they bake twelve thousand cakes for the gala costume party on the ship.

After two days of nonstop baking, the girls are exhausted. They set their cupcakes on a raft in the pool outside the festivities. A rainstorm ensues, and the display topples into the water. Jenna comes to the rescue and salvages many of the cupcakes for the banquet. The girls complete the journey, including a visit to Disney World, and Marisol makes a decision. With her mother's blessing, she will realize her dream of becoming a photographer.
