
A Curriculum guide for grades 3, 4, and 5

SNAPSHOT SUMMARY:

Peace, Love, and Cupcakes tells the story of nine-year-old Kylie Carson, who overcomes a bully, Meredith, by organizing a cupcake club at school with her friends Lexi, Jenna, and Sadie. Her small enterprise gathers momentum as the group becomes popular and sells its products to a bakery, an anniversary party, a birthday celebration, and several school functions. All ends well, as Meredith realizes her shortcomings, and she and Kylie call a truce to their animosity.



FULL-LENGTH SUMMARY:

Kylie Carson is a new girl at the Blakely School, and during a class presentation on her favorite topic of monsters, she is insulted and degraded by Meredith, the class bully. Kylie decides to join a club in order to gain friends. She auditions for the hip-hop club but is unsuccessful. In her attempt, she accidently loses her sneaker and hits Meredith with it. The bully vows revenge.

Ms. Dubois organizes a play for the school's Wellness Program. Kylie has the role of a turnip, and Meredith mocks her. She develops nightmares but eventually stands up to her nemesis. She decides, with the help of her teacher, Juliette, to develop a baking club and asks Lexi, a shy artist; Jenna, another bullying victim; and Sadie, a holdover basketball player, to join her in the project. Each brings their attributes to the club, and Kylie becomes the president. Their goal is to work as a team and have fun.

Wearing their purple aprons, the girls assemble to make chocolate chip muffins. Due to their lack of experience and a series of mishaps, the first batch of baked goods are a disaster and inedible. They resolve to try again, and the cupcakes are a success. They sell a batch of baked goods to raise funds for the school eco center and then make 250 cupcakes for a restaurant in Greenwich called the Golden Spoon. They work long into the night as their business gains popularity, and they extend into production for anniversary and birthday parties. Kylie's father helps with the deliveries.

At Christmas, the class decides to have Secret Santa. Kylie and Meredith choose each other's names. The latter refuses the choice, but others in the class select Kylie. She finally realizes that her classmates accept and admire her, and her dream of friendship is now a reality.

The Cupcake Club is asked by Meredith's mother to bake cupcakes for the girl's gala birthday party. The bully is violently allergic to cinnamon, but Kylie sprinkles it, in retribution, on Meredith's cake. The party is ruined, as she becomes quite ill. Kylie has had her revenge but feels remorse for her evil deed. She confesses to the principal, her parents, and Meredith's father. Her reprimand comes in the form of an apology to Meredith and baking seven hundred cupcakes for Field Day.

Meredith loses her necklace at the tug-of-war event, and Kylie finds it. She returns it to her enemy, who hugs her in appreciation. Kylie has now achieved all of her goals. She has been accepted in her school, has three good friends, and has ended the threat of bullying.

- 13. How did Kylie finally overcome Meredith's bullying? Have you ever stopped someone from bullying you?
- 14. What makes each character unique?



- Role play in skit form by breaking into groups—bullying, organizing the club, baking, big business, and Kylie and the Cupcake Club as winners.
